At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta legally notified and warned, and held by adjournment at the Town House in said Augusta on the 23rd day of March 1846.

ARTICLE 20, To the Selectmen of the Town of Augusta.

The undersigned citizens of Augusta respectfully represent that there being a fair prospect of the extension of the Village in Augusta, by the demand for vacant land, on the west side of the river, for the purposes of building, it is desirable that streets should be laid out without running the hazard, by delay, of having their regularity and symmetry impaired, by the erection of buildings on ground over which they ought to pass.

To effect in part this object, and to promote public accommodation convenience and necessity, the undersigned pray that Sewall Street may be laid out and extended southerly, to the road or street leading westerly from State Street by the residence of Levi Johnson through and by the estate of William Norcross.

And as in duty bound, will ever pray.

Beginning on the south side of Green Street, on the north west corner of land of Nathan Weston; thence running South 25 degrees West on his westerly line of said Weston land, through to Western Avenue, said road to be three rods wide this being the easterly line of the same. No damages claimed.

ARTICLE 20 VOTED, To accept a road on the west side of Kennebec River as the same is laid out and reported by the Selectmen on the petition of Nathan Weston and others as follows, to wit; "Beginning on the south side of Greene Street on the northwest corner of land of Judge Weston; thence running South 25 degrees West, on the westerly line of said Weston's land through to the Western Avenue. Said road to be three rods wide. This being the easterly line of the same. No damages claimed."

ARTICLE 6~

At the Annual Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in town affairs legally notified and called. Holden at the Town House is said Augusta on Monday the ninth day of March; \_\_\_\_\_ and by adjournment on the 23rd day of March 1840.~

To the Selectmen of the Town of Augusta~

The undersigned believing that the public convenience requires the location of a street now called "Sewall Street" according to a plan of this Village made by B. F. Perham-namely.~

Beginning at the north east corner of Ephraim Dutton's lot on Winthrop Street at a stone bound and running in a south or south by west direction to Green Street to a stone bound in the south east corner of S. Gardiner's lot said street to be about fifty feet wide eastwardly of said line; and we would respectfully request you, after giving notice to all persons interested therein to layout said street as above described being the same as now fenced and travelled.

The undersigned have this day laid out a road or street on the within petition as follows, to wit:

Commencing at a stone bound in the north east corner of Ephraim Dutton's land and in the south line of Winthop Street; thence running South 28 degrees West about fifty-three and a half rods to a stone bound in the north line of Green Street; said street to be three rods wide and east of said line. All persons interested were notified and no damages were claimed by any person.
