February 7, 1837

VOTED

The Selectmen of Augusta having previously given due and seasonable notice to all persons who they knew to be interested, laid out a street commencing on the south side of Winthrop Street, and at the northwest corner of land owned by Alfred Redington; thence running South twenty-seven and a half degrees West to Green Street, said street to be east of the above line and course and to be three rods wide, said street passes over land in part reserved for a highway and in part on land owned by James Bridge and Loring Cushing by whom there will be some damage claimed but the amount we are unable to state. It is understood that Mr. Cushing claims about fifty dollars in consequence of a part of his door yard being taken for said street.

VOTED

ARTICLE 6 VOTED, To accept a road laid out by the Selectmen on the petition of Loring Cushing and others, agreeably to the report of the laying out of the same, provided no damages are claimed. Which report is as follows, viz: Beginning on the south side of Greene Street; thence running South 26 ½ degrees West through to the Western Avenue, it being an extension of Orchard Street. All parties were notified by posting up two notices more than seven days prior to said location.

ARTICLE 6 VOTED, At Special Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote on Town affairs duly and legally notified and held at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday the 23rd day of March A.D., 1846 at two o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 6, To the Selectmen of Augusta.

Gentlemen:

The public convenience requires that a road should be made extending Orchard Street from Green Street to Western Avenue and request that you would proceed and locate the same.
