To the Selectmen of Augusta

The undersigned believing the public good would be promoted by the opening of a street on the East side of the Kennebec river beginning on the east side of Arsenal street nearly opposite the dwelling house occupied by Israel G. Johnson, thence easterly pass the north side of the House, occupied by Homer Webster and William B. Hartwell to Middle Street-request you to lay out a street as above-and lay your doings before the town for their acceptance if they should see fit.

Augusta, March 2, 1846

Augusta, March 10, 1846 The undersigned Selectmen of Augusta have this day laid out the following road upon the within petition Viz: Beginning on the westerly line of middle Street at a Stone monument-thence running north 75 degrees west to a stone monument on the Easterly line of Arsenal Street distance 36 Rods-This being the North line of said location-and to be 40 feet wide-all parties were notified by posting up two notices more than seven days prior to said location.

No damages claimed.

The undersigned Selectmen of Augusta have this day laid out the following road upon the within petition, viz:

This being the north line of said location, and to be 40 feet wide. All parties were notified by posting up two notices more than seven days prior to said location. No damages claimed.
