The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the petition of Albert W. Brooks to layout and establish Brooks Street and St. Catherine Street, reported that the City establish and construct the same according to bounds duly filed with the City Clerk (See Volume Laying Out and Alteration of Streets) and accept and allow the laying out and said bounds, provided the land be given the City and provided the expense should not exceed, in case of Brooks Street, fifty dollars, and in the case of St. Catherine Street, thirty dollars.

The reports were severally read and accepted, the bounds and admeasurements, accepted and allowed, and the street laid out and established. Sent Down for Concurrence.

The Joint Standing Committee on New Streets, to whom was referred the Petition of Albert W. Brooks and others, to layout and establish Saint Catherine Street, so-called, having considered the matter therein, beg leave to report

That the City establish and construct Saint Catherine Street, so-called, as now laid out, to wit:

According to the bounds and admeasurements of said street which were filed with the City Clerk on May 1896, and which are hereby made a part of this report. Also that the City accept and allow said laying out and said bounds and admeasurements.

Provided that the land included in said bounds and admeasurements be given to the City, and that the expense of establishing and constructing said street shall not exceed thirty \$30 dollars.

The following are the bounds and admeasurements referred to in said report.

Surveyor's Report

Of the lines and admeasurements of a new street to be called Saint Catherine Street.

Beginning at a stone bound on the south side of East Chestnut Street 238 feet westerly from the west line of Middle Street, measuring on the south line of East Chestnut Street; thence running South 21 degrees 30 minutes West, passing west of lots numbered 3, 5, 7, 9, 11 and 13, according to Capen's plan, to the north line of the Brook's lot, so-called; thence southerly parallel to the west line of Middle Street to a contemplated street called Brooks Street and this line to be the west line of said street. The east line to be parallel with the above described line, and 40 feet distant therefrom.

Reference is hereby made to a plan accompanying the report of the Committee on New Streets.
