SENATOR WAY (FORMERLY STOREY STREET)

Storey Street was discontinued by the City of Augusta on November 8, 2006 as a request from Packard Development for their project, Augusta Crossing. In September/October 2007, Packard Development approached the City of Augusta to change the name of the road known as Storey Street. Apparently as part of Packard Development's deal with the Senator Inn during the purchase of the Senator's back land, Packard was to name one of their roads Senator Way.

The road known as Storey Street would be the ideal road to name as Senator Way since it is the access for the Senator Inn. It was for this reason that Packard approached the City to request a name change. Since the City discontinued the road, it was now considered to be private. Because of this, the City did not have to formally vote for the name change as long as the E-911 addressing officer approved of the new name. The name was approved as Senator Way by the addressing officer.

Title: Discontinuance – Storey Street

BE IT ORDERED by the City Council of the City of Augusta that the public way known as Storey Street, no longer of public use and necessity, be discontinued; and

The description of the discontinued road shall match the descriptions of all portions of the road acceptance for Storey Street by the City on October 20, 1958, and November 9, 1960.

That the City chooses to retain a public easement over the herein described area for public utility facilities to provide services and that there shall be zero damages be paid to abutting property owners, as would be allowed under 23 M.R.S.A. §3026.

Description of area where a public easement, for the purposes described above, shall be retained: Beginning at the southerly edge of the Western Avenue right-of-way and extending approximately 518.2 feet south and 40 feet wide on the westerly edge of the so-called “Kennebec Journal Lot” over a portion of Storey Street, as shown on the plan entitled “Storey Street Subdivision – Augusta, Maine: Development by Capital Development Co, Portland, Maine”. Said plan was approved by the City of Augusta planning commission on March 2, 1960, and recorded at the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds on April 11, 1960, volume 22, pages 54 and 55.
