

A special meeting of the members of the City Government was called by the Mayor for consideration and any possible action on the purchase of property of the American Legion and Harry Jose situated on the West bank of the Kennebec River, same to be used for a Municipal Parking Place.

It was moved, seconded, and passed by vote to suspend Rule 9 Page 103 of the Revised Charter and Ordinances. The following orders were passed.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN

- A 284 ORDERED, That the Mayor be, and hereby is authorized, and directed to purchase in the name, and on behalf of the City of Augusta from the Fitzgerald-Cummings Post #2, American Legion, the building known as the "Legion Home," situated on the water front at the end of Winthrop Street, extended, together with what rights in contiguous land may go with said property, for the sum of \$6500.00 (Sixty-Five Hundred Dollars): AND BE IT FURTHER ORDERED THAT the sum of \$6500.00 (Sixty-Five Hundred Dollars) be, and hereby is appropriated for the purchase of the above described property; and the treasurer is hereby authorized, and directed to pay the same on direction of the Mayor.
- A 285 ORDERED, That The Mayor be, and hereby is authorized to make a contract in the name, and on behalf of the City of Augusta to purchase the building standing on the "Harry Jose property", so-called, situated in the rear of, or the easterly side of the Augusta Post Office, from Harry Jose for the sum of \$2,000.00 (Two Thousand Dollars).

Robinson, as constructed by said City of Augusta and a profile description and plan of which, made by the Engineering Department of the City of Augusta and dated July 19, 1947, is on file with City Clerk of said City, and do further hereby estimate and assess upon said lots and parcels of land, and against the persons named below, in accordance with Chapter 84 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Maine, the following sums, said sums being the benefit the undersigned deem just and equitable towards defraying the expenses of constructing and completing said sewer, and the whole of said assessments not exceeding one-half the cost of said sewer:

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

A-191 Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Augusta, as follows:

ORDERED, That Chapter XIX of the Revised Ordinances be amended by adding thereto at the end of Section 1 thereof the following:

"No sewer or drain shall be constructed until 100 % of the abutting owners of property along the line thereof shall petition the Municipal Officers for the construction thereof and agree to pay the sewer assessment and the cost of connecting to the main sewer and assessment, if any, for a sewage disposal plant."

A-192 ORDERED, That the City Council of the City of Augusta does hereby reaffirm its acceptance of Sections 136-141 of Chapter 84 of the Revised Statutes.

A-193 ORDERED, That after the date hereof the sewer entrance fee on sewers already built or now being built be and is hereby declared to be \$50.
The above three orders were re-referred to the Highway Committee for consolidation.

- A-67 ORDERED, That the City Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to execute a quitclaim deed to Ingraham Chevrolet, Inc. for the purpose of releasing whatever interest the City of Augusta has in and to a strip of land forty (40) feet, more or less, in width extending from Arsenal St. to Stone St. across the land of said Ingraham Chevrolet, Inc. and used for purposes of passage.
- A-128 ORDERED, That ornament at tip of flagstaff in Monument Park be replaced with an American War Veteran's "Thank You Star" in accordance with attached letter.
- A-129 ORDERED, That a sidewalk be constructed on north side of Cumberland street length of which to be from Oxford street easterly to Washington Street.
- A-161 ORDERED, That a sewer be constructed along Bond Brook Road west of Mt. Vernon Avenue from the Rendering Plant to the Brookside Garage as soon as funds are available.

A-162 ORDERED, That the Bolton Hill-Cross Hill road be improved to connect with the third class highway coming from Center Vassalboro.

A-123 ORDERED, That a sidewalk be constructed on the west side of Royal Park (Boothby Street) beginning at the junction of Mt. Vernon Ave. southerly approximately five hundred feet.

A-167 ORDERED, That Arthur Katon and Frank Cushing be retained in their present capacities in the employ of the City of Augusta beyond the normal retirement age of 70 so long as they desire and perform their duties with their present satisfactory service.

A-175 Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Augusta, as follows:

ORDERED, That Chapter I of the Revised Ordinances be amended by striking out said chapter and inserting in its place the following:

Chapter I
City Seal

The design hereto annexed shall, as of Jan. 1, 1948, be the device of the City Seal, and the inscription shall be as follows, to-wit:

A-177 Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Augusta, as follows:

ORDERED, That Chapter XVIII of the Revised Ordinances be amended by adding thereto at the end thereof a new section to be called Section 16 and to read as follows:

"Section 16. The failure to cut and remove grasses, weeds, bushes and underbrush from any vacant lot within the City limits as defined by Section 7 of this Chapter, so as to bring about a condition dangerous in causing or promoting fires, is hereby declared to be illegal, and failure of the owner or person in possession of said lot to remove the same within seven days of written notification by the chief engineer of the fire department shall be punishable by a fine of not more than ten dollars for each offense and every day during which said material remains contrary to said notice shall constitute a separate offense."

A-180 ORDERED, That pursuant to Chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to give notice of a hearing of the Municipal Officers at the City Hall on Dec. 15, 1947 to consider the relocation of a telephone and light pole in front of Parents Garage on lower State St. to a new position on the south side of Britt Road.

The following orders were read and passed by both branches.

A-182 ORDERED, That pursuant to the revised Statutes of 1944, Chapter 80, Section 96, the Mayor and Treasurer are hereby authorized to issue and negotiate from time to time during the municipal fiscal year beginning January 1, 1948, notes for the City to an aggregate face amount not exceeding \$400,000.00 for temporary loans to be paid during the said year out of money raised during such current year by taxes and also to renew such notes from time to time provided that all such renewal notes shall also be paid as aforesaid.
