The undersigned Citizens of Augusta and Taxpayers, respectfully ask that Valley Street running north from Child Street and connecting with Glendon Street as shown upon Capen's

plan of Stapleton, on file in Kennebec Registry of Deeds, be accepted and opened as a public highway.

Petitioned by 60 people

The foregoing Petition was Read and Referred to the Committee on New Streets and Order of Notice directed in the Common Council and Came Up for Concurrence. It was subsequently Read and Referred to the Committee on New Streets and Order of Notice Directed in Concurrence.

Pursuant to the above the following notice was given.

STATE OF MAINE

City of Augusta, SS

WHEREAS, application is made to the City Council of said Augusta to layout a new street in said City, to wit:

A street leading north from Child Street, which is its southern terminus to Glendon Street, which is its northern terminus, as shown upon Capen's plan of Stapleton now on file in Kennebec Registry of Deeds to which reference is hereby had, and

WHEREAS, said City Council has directed an Order of Notice upon son application,

All persons interested are therefore notified of the intention of the City Council to layout said street and are hereby further notified to appear before the Joint Committee of the City Council of New Streets, being a Committee of the City Council having the matter in charge at the Aldermen's Room in City Hall in said Augusta on Wednesday the 26th day of May, A.D., 1897, at two of the clock in the afternoon, at which time and place a hearing relative to the proposed laying out of said street will be had.

The Joint Standing Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of Charles Allard and others to layout Valley Street, running north from Child Street and connecting with Glendon Street having considered the matter therein, beg leave to report.

That pursuant to the order of the City Council directing an order of notice on such application, the City Clerk, under the direction of your said Committee, caused written notices of the intention of the City Council to layout said street, in accordance with Section I of Chapter XI of the City Ordinances, notifying all persons interested to appear at a time and place stated in said notices, to be posted in two public places in the vicinity of the proposed street at least seven days before the time of such meeting. That the Committee met at the appointed time and place and heard all persons interested and appearing, and were unanimously of opinion that there is no necessity for the acceptance and establishment of said street, and respectfully recommend that the petitioners be given leave to withdraw.

We, the undersigned taxpayers and residents of the City of Augusta, living in the vicinity of Child and Powhattan Streets, respectfully petition your honorable body that there may be laid out forthwith a public street or way running from Child Street, so-called, to Powhattan Street, so-called, in said Augusta, where there is now a private-way commonly called Valley Street, We respectfully petition your honorable body that said private-way may be duly and legally accepted as a highway, inasmuch as the convenience and comfort of the public demands a highway at that point.

We respectfully petition that due and legal notice pursuant to the statutes may be given and said way legally established.
