The undersigned have this day laid out a road on the petition of John F. Wade upon which notice was ordered by the City Council at their regular meeting held April 24, 1858 as follows:

Commencing in the west line of the Burns Road, so-called, and in the north line of the Eight Rod Road range way as shown to us, having the north line of Gilman Creasy's land east of said road and continued across the same; thence running North 64 ½ degrees West sixteen rods to land of John F. Wade being the east line of the gore, said road to be two rods wide and south of said line, due notice of the laying out thereof having been posted in the vicinity thereof as required by the City Ordinance a copy of which, together with said petition accompanies this report, said road if established should be as a private way for the benefit of said Petitioner. The same being on a range way damages cannot be claimed.

At the time and place appropriated your committee met and heard all persons interested in said Street and its discontinuance, and after full hearing your Committee decided that said Street should be discontinued. No damages being claimed on account of said action, they assess none.
