To the City Council of Augusta.

The undersigned hereby represent that a road commencing at the south end of the road leading from the County Road near Hiram McCausland, southerly and running southerly to the Belfast Road, would be of much public convenience, they therefore request that you cause the premises to be examined, and if found as represented, to cause said road to be laid out and located in such place as shall be considered best.

City of Augusta, June 14, 1851

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of John E. Ward and others for a continuation of the road leading by the house of Joshua Ward, to the New Belfast Road have had that subject under consideration, and ask leave to report. That in conformity with a notice posted up on the 13th day of May 1851 in two public places in the City of Augusta, of the intention of the City Council to layout the same on the 21st day of May at 9 o'clock a.m. at the house of John E. Ward. Your Committee met at the time and place mentioned in said notice and proceeded to layout the same as follows, viz:

The west line to commence at the termination of the west line of the road leading by the house of Joshua Ward at a stone bound; thence South seventy degrees West, thirty-nine rods to a stake;

thence South fifty-six degrees West, seventy-three rods and nine feet to a stake; thence South twenty-five degrees West, one hundred and twenty-eight rods and eight feet to a stake on the north line of the New Belfast Road. Said road to be laid to the east of said line, and to be three rods wide.

Your Committee would recommend that this road be accepted and built as far as the first angle or the first thirty-nine rods. No damage is claimed for any part of this road.

Barrows et als, have attended to the duty assigned them and ask leave to report, that after having given legal notice, they proceeded to view the premises and after having the parties did this 4th day of September 1852, locate the following street, to wit:

Beginning at a stone marked R in the northerly line of the street leading by the house of Joshua Ward; thence running South 57 degrees West, 15 rods to the northerly line of land of the said Ward. The above line to be the northerly line of said street and the street to be four rods wide and no land damages claimed and no expense to the City for making the said Ward agreeing to construct the same at his own expense.

The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the petition of Joshua Ward and others on April 4th, 1857 having attended to the duty assigned them.

Report that the distance between the two point named in said petition is one hundred and seventy rods or thereabouts and that Joshua Ward, John E. Ward and Samuel Cunningham, Jr., have offered in writing to make it for 75 cents per rod and fix it this fall: so as to answer for a winter road, and finish it next fall, and wait till next fall for their pay, the road already made extends about two thirds of the distance a cross from H. McCausland to the Belfast Road, and is of no public benefit unless it is continued through, and as the expense will not exceed one hundred and thirty dollars; to make it through, 18 feet wide, we think it would be advisable to have the same laid out and established.

Whereas the City Council of the City of Augusta have been petition by Joshua Ward et al, to layout a street or road in said City commencing at the south end of the road leading southerly from the County Road near Hiram McCausland and running southerly to and terminating at the New Belfast Road, and the said Council at a session thereof on the 29th day of August last, ordered the City Clerk to give notice of the intention of said Council to layout said proposed street or road. All persons interested are hereby notified to appear before a Committee of said Council at the house of Joshua Ward near said proposed road on the 17th day of September instant when and where said Committee will proceed to layout the same.

I have this day by request of the City Clerk, posted up two notices, copies of the within in public places in the vicinity of the proposed road within name. One of which I posted on the School House near Hiram McCausland and the other on a stump on the north side of the New Belfast Road near the southern termination of the road to be laid out.

The undersigned Committee on New Streets have by direction of the City Council this day laid out a road on the petition of Joshua Ward and others, as follows:

Commencing at a stake in the west line of the road leading southerly from the road near Hiram McCausland and at the south end of said road as now laid out; thence running South 58 3/4 degrees West, 46 1/2 rods to a stake in John E. Ward's field; thence South 34 degrees West, fifty-one rods to a stake between two stones; thence South 57 1/2 degrees West, thirty rods to a stake in the north side of a field; thence 55 1/2 degrees West, twenty-one rods to a stake about six feet west of a large stone or boulder; thence South 49 degrees West, forty-three rods to the New Belfast Road said road to be four rods wide and east of the above described line.
