March 2, 1846

VOTED

At a special meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote on Town affairs duly and legally notified and held at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday the 23rd day of March A.D., 1846 at two o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 5, VOTED, To accept two roads laid out by the Selectmen on the petition of Alfred Redington's Agent - agreeably to their report of the laying out of the same. Which report is as follows:

Beginning at a stake in the fence on the easterly line of the road leading to Sidney near the house of Church Williams on Sand Hill; thence running North 22 degrees East, 121 rods, to the south line of land formerly owned by Church Williams, passing 17 links west of an apple tree on land of the Kennebec Lock and Canal Company, marked thus X; thence North 8 degrees East 30 rods, to the north line of the Church Williams lot; this being the east line of the location.

Also, beginning on the east line of the Belgrade Road on the south west corner of the above named Church Williams lot; thence South 66 degrees East 72 rods to the west line of the above described road, this being the north line of said location. All parties were notified by posting up two notices, more than seven days prior to this date (March 10, 1846).
