A-157 Washington Street Place accepted as a City Street.

The Joint Standing Committee on Highway and Sewer to whom was referred the order for the acceptance of Washington Street Place as a City Street. Having considered the matter therein reported that same should be accepted according to the following description.

A small strip or parcel of land on the west side of the river in Augusta, Maine. Beginning at an iron pipe on the easterly side of Washington Street 136.79 feet south from the south side of York Street, so-called; thence south 57 degrees 00 minutes in a line at right angles with the easterly side of Washington Street 150 feet; thence at right angles south 33 degrees 00 minutes West 20 feet; thence at right angles north 57 degrees 00 minutes West 150 feet to an iron pipe on the easterly side of Washington Street; thence north 35 degrees 00 minutes East along the easterly side of Washington Street 20 feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land 20 feet wide and 150 feet long on the easterly side of Washington Street all as shown on plan of Washington Court, made by Waldo W. Hill, City Engineer, July 9, 1942, on file in the City Clerk's Office.

Report Read and Accepted. Order Passed and the street accepted as a public way.

and assigns forever, a certain lot or parcel of land situate in said Augusta, bounded and described as follows:
