The whole street to run upon their land.

ARTICLE 12 VOTED, That the vote passed at the meeting of the 4th of March, recommiting to the Selectmen their report of the laying out of the road mentioned in this article, with instructions to layout the same anew, be reconsidered.

VOTED, To accept a road on the west side of Kennebec River, agreeably, to the report of the Selectmen of the laying out of the same, which report is as follows, viz: Beginning at a stake in the west line of Chapel Street two feet southerly from the Matthew Heywood line and running parallel with Court Street to Sewall Street and just passing by the north side of a poplar tree near Chapel Street on the Foye lot. Said road is to be thirty five feet wide, - thirty-three feet north of the Matthew Heywood line and two feet southerly from said Heywood's line. All persons being notified by posting up two warrants seven days before said laying out and no damages are claimed.

Article 16, Under Article 16 the following report was submitted to wit:

We the undersigned being appointed a committee to examine into the propriety of altering the road laid out west of Charles Williams' old store, having had the same under consideration ask lease to report. That part of the road west of Daniel Sheridan's north line being twenty feet wide in consequence of its being used about that width as an open passage way for more than twenty years; and if it was laid out any wider there would be more damages. The road south of Sheridan's south line is thirty feet wide, being a reserve by the proprietors, no damages claimed. Your committee have come to the conclusion that any alteration would be improper.

Which report being read. VOTED, That the same be accepted.

VOTED, That the road referred to in the preceding report be accepted agreeably to the report of the Selectmen of the laying out of the same, which is as follows, viz:

Commencing at Winthrop Street two and one-half feet west of the northwest corner of Luther Perkins' old store; thence South 30 degrees West 14 1/2 rods to a stake in Court Street. Said road lying west of said monument. Said road south of Sheridan's north line is to be thirty feet

wide and said road from said Sheridan's north line to Winthrop Street is twenty feet wide. All persons were notified and damages claimed by Alvah Josselyn.

ARTICLE 16, To the Selectmen of Augusta.

The undersigned legal voters in the Town of Augusta, respectfully request you to layout a road in this Village.

Beginning in the south line of Winthrop Street between the lot occupied by George W. Jones, and that occupied by Arthur L. and Sumner W. Getchell, and running southerly on said Jones' west line to the north line of Court Street making the road twenty feet wide from said Jones' line and no more from Winthrop Street to Daniel Sheridan's north line, and from that point thirty feet wide.

The Committee on New Streets to whom was referred the Petition of H. A. Dewitt and others, for a new street from Chapel Street to State Street being a continuation of Weston Street over and across the Mansion House Lot, and upon which notice was ordered to be given by the City Council, on the 4th day of September 1878.

Report

That pursuant to the notices posted by the City Clerk (a copy of which with his certificate thereon is herewith returned). We met at the time and place therein stated, at the paint shop of

B.F. Morse on the 23rd day of November 1878 at 4 o'clock p.m. and laid out a street as follows, to wit: Commencing at a point in the east line of Chapel Street opposite the street sign post on the west side of said street, and in range with the fence on the south side of Weston Street in front of Lewis Tibbetts lot; thence running easterly in the same course of said Tibbetts fence to State Street, taking from L. W. Lithgow's lot on Chapel Street as now fenced four feet and two inches and at his north east corner or near it, the line passes and thence continues on the south line of the Mansion House lot to State Street, said street to be thirty-three feet wide and north of said line. No damages are awarded by us.

To the City Council of the City of Augusta the undersigned citizens of Augusta respectfully represent that Weston Place is very narrow, that public convenience requires that the same should be widened, wherefore the undersigned pray that the same may be made wider on the west side thereof from the south side of Court Street to the land of Asa Redington's by continuing the west line of Perham Street from Court Street to said Redington's land the same being over the land of the County of Kennebec in rear of the new Jail and as duty bound will ever pray.

The foregoing petition was read and recommitted to the Committee on New Streets by the City Council, November 27th, A.D. 1858 and notice ordered on which said Committee made the following report viz:

The Committee on New Streets to whom was recommitted the petition of B. C. Robinson and others by the City Council November 27, 1858 report that they have on the 18th day of December 1858 widened Weston Place as follows:

Commencing at a point in the south line of Court Street, seven feet west from the north east corner of the new jail lot; thence running South 25 degrees West in a course parallel with the east end of the new jail to the south line of the jail lot or until it intersects the west line of Weston Place as before established, said line if adopted by the City Council will make Weston Place 33 feet wide at the north end, and will intersect the present west line thereof before it gets to the south end of said place; due notice was given of the laying out thereof, as will appear by the copy and return thereon by the City Marshal, herewith returned.
