March 9, 1840

VOTED

At the annual meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in Town affairs legally notified and called. Holden at the Town House in said Augusta on Monday the ninth day of March; and by adjournment on the 23rd day of March 1840.

ARTICLE 6, To the Selectmen Town of Augusta.

We the undersigned proprietors and holders of real estate on Winter Street represent that we are very much incommoded by the present state of said street and our property is less valuable than it would be if the Street were laid out accepted and made. We therefor request you to layout said street 40 feet wide. (If all the proprietors of land thereon consent to it without expense to the Town for land) or if otherwise lay it out its present width thirty-eight feet, and call a meeting of the Town to accept said street in order that it may be made this present season, and as in duty bound.

The undersigned have this day laid out a street on the within petition as follows, viz: Commencing at the north west corner of Luther Severance's land and in the south line of Bridge Street; thence running southerly the same course that Luther Severance's west fence now running to a stone bound. in or near the north line of Winthrop Street. Said street to be 38 feet wide and west of said line, all persons interested were notified, and no damages were claimed by any person, and none awarded by us.
