TITLE Discontinuance of a Portion of Winthrop Street

ORDERED, That a portion of Winthrop Street as described below be discontinued.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, That the City chooses not to retain a public easement over the herein described area and that there shall be zero damages paid to abutting property owners, as would be allowed under Title 23, M.R.S.A. section 3026.

Beginning at the intersection of the west line of Dickman Street with the north line of Winthrop Street; thence south 33 degrees, 37 minutes, 13 seconds west along the projected westerly right-of-way line of Dickman Street 9.29 feet to a point; thence north 65 degrees 27 minutes, 27 seconds west 201.09 feet +/- to a point on the northerly right-of-way line of Winthrop Street, said point being the southeast corner of property currently or formerly owned by John A. and Rebecca O. Hurley (tax map 34, lot 39); thence south 68 degrees three minutes 18 seconds east along the existing right-of-way line of Winthrop Street 202.77 feet to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a portion of the Winthrop Street right-of-way westerly of Dickman Street that is triangular in shape, 9.31 feet at the base and 201.09 feet in length, containing 936 +/- square feet for the purpose of building a new public parking structure westerly of Dickman Street and northerly of Winthrop Street.

Massachusetts to notify and warn the male inhabitants of said town, being twenty-one years of age and resident in said town for the space of one year next preceding, having a freehold estate within said town of the annual income of three pounds or any estate to the value of sixty pounds, to meet at the Townhouse in said Augusta on Monday the third day of May next, at two o'clock P.M. for the purpose of choosing one or more Representatibes to represent them in the General Court appointed to be convened and held at Boston on the last Wednesday of May next. Hereof fail not, and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon, to us or either of us, at or before the time of said meeting. Given under our hands and seals at said Augusta, the tenth day of April, A.D. 1813.

Augusta ss. April 19, 1813. Pursuant to this warrant I have notified the freeholders and other inhabitants of the town of Augusta to meet at the time and place and for the purposes within mentioned, by posting up copies of this warrant at the meetinghouse and at the two other places directed by a standing vote of the town, fourteen days prior to the time of holding said meeting.

James Black, Constable

Commonwealth of Massachusetts. County of Kennebec. Pursuant to a law of this Commonwealth, the freeholders and other inhabitants of the town of Augusta, qualified according to the Constitution, having been duly convened in town meeting, on the third day of May current, for the choice of a Representative or Representatives in the Legislature of this Commonwealth, and after deciding by a large majority to send two representatives, did then and there elect George Crosby and Seth Williams, being inhabitants of said town, to represent them in the General Court to be convened and holden on the last Wednesday of the same month. Dated the third day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.




