Beginning at the southwest corner of lot #31 according to "A portion of property owned by S.D. Blaisdell" by Carl H. Crane C.E.; thence westerly along the southerly line of lots #28 and #27 a distance of one hundred thirty feet (130'); thence southerly thirty five feet (35') to the northwest corner of lot #36; thence easterly along the northerly line of lots #36, #34 and a part

of #32 a distance of one hundred thirty feet (130'); thence northerly thirty-five feet (35') to the point of beginning.

Meaning and intending to describe a parcel of land one hundred thirty feet (130') long and thirty-five feet (35') wide extending westerly of lot #31.
