May 6, 1822

A town road on the W. side of Kennebec River- Beg. on the N. E. corner of lot No. 29 in the second range of lots thence extending S.ly on the 8 rod allowance to the rangeway leading from Sam'l Woodward's to the Belgrade rd. thence across said rangeway the distance of 8 Rods thence N.ly parallel with the S. line of the road now laid our and in the 8 R. allowance to the point opposite the place of beginning at the distance therefrom.

VOTED

At a special meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Augusta qualified to vote in Town affairs legally notified and held May 14<sup>th</sup>, 1838.

ARTICLE 3, To the Selectmen of Augusta.

The undersigned Inhabitants of Augusta respectfully represent, that a road commencing on the eight rod allowance near Samuel Woodward and terminating at the Belgrade Road near John Arnold Jr. would be of great utility to the Inhabitants of this Town and to the community in general.

We therefore request your Honors to layout a road south of the north line of said rangeway as surveyed by John Woodcock surveyor, and as in duty bound will ever pray.

The undersigned on the sixteenth day of April eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, laid out a road on the within petition.

Commencing at the River Road at a stone bound near the dwelling house of Samuel Woodward on the north line of the rangeway; thence running westerly to the Belgrade Road on said line, to a stone bound, being the same line which was run by John Woodcock in 1837, said road to be four

rods wide and to lay south of said line - all persons interested were notified and no damages were claimed or allowed.

We had a surveyor to run the line, and we are satisfied that the line run by John Woodcock in 1837 for the north line of said rangeway is as correct a line as can be run.

VOTED

ARTICLE 14<sup>th</sup>, - Report, The undersigned acting under a vote of the Town at their last annual meeting, directing them to take such measures as they should deem necessary for the removal of a stone wall standing upon the rangeway leading from Samuel Woodward, to the Belgrade Road. Would report, that they notified Mr. Lambard (whose wall was to be moved) of the instructions we had received from the Town, and that unless satisfactory arrangements could be made, we should be obliged to pursue the course indicated by the above named vote. Mr. Lambard assured us that an agreement had been entered into between himself and Mr. Arnold which he thought would be satisfactory to us and the Town. Whereupon we went upon the ground and examined their propositions, and with some immaterial alterations (which they agreed to) were satisfied would make a better and cheaper road than if the whole wall were removed, as well as present bad feelings between neighbors and perhaps litigation between an individual and the Town. We therefore proceeded to layout the road, conforming to the bounds following, viz:

Beginning in the west line of the rangeway between the first and second mile west of the river three rods north of Lambard's stone wall; thence westerly parallel with said wall ninety-two rods; thence North 68 degrees West fifty-one rods to the Belgrade Road where it strikes the Woodcock monument in the north line of the rangeway. The road to be three rods wide the whole distance and south of the above named line. We procured from the owners of the land interested the annexed agreement.

All which we lay before the Town, and which if it accepts, we trust will forever put an end to this vexed subject.

ARTICLE 26 VOTED, To accept a road on the west side of Kennebec River agreeably to the report of the Selectmen of the laying out of the same; which report is as follows: Commencing near Samuel Hutchins' dwelling house, about two rods west of the east line of the rangeway at the end of the first mile and running parallel with the line of said rangeway, keeping two rods therefrom, about one hundred and twenty rods to the land of Nathan Woodward. Said road to be four rods wide and west of said bounds. All parties being notified by posting up two notices more than seven days before said location and no damages claimed.

ARTICLE 26, To the Selectmen of the Town of Augusta

The undersigned legal voters of Augusta, respectfully request you to layout a road on the eight rod rangeway between the first and second ranges, on the west side of the River in Augusta leading from Samuel Hutchins' house northerly, on said rangeway, to the south line of the Town of Sidney.

Said road to be four rods wide and west of said bounds.

All parties being notified by posting up two notifications more than seven days before said locations and no damages claimed.
