BOUNDS AND ADMEASUREMENTS OF WYMAN STREET

The Committee on new street presented the following report. The Committee on new streets having been notified by the City Clerk to lay out a new street as prayed for by the petition of B.F. Parrott and nine others presented to the city council Sept. 3, 1886 and referred to said committee who reported in favor of the same Oct. 1st and said report was accepted and an order passed for the city clerk to issue the necessary notices to persons interested and said notices having been posted up, one at each end of the proposed street we have this day laid out the same as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a stake in the S. line of Winthrop St. four rods E. of the N. E. corner of the lot occupied by Wm.H. Brooks and from thence running S. about 25 1/2 W. and parallel with the E. 251.63 line of said Brooks lot fifteen and one quarter rods to the North line of a line or passageway, said street to be thirty feet wide and on the E.ly side of said line, a copy of one of the notices is herewith returned together with the petition and other papers referred to. No damage was claimed by any person and none allowed by us.
