OLD BUSINESS AND TABLED MATTERS

HAS BEEN READ AND TABLED

124 Manager (Department of City Services)  
ORDERED, That the following property located at 759 Eastern Ave, Augusta, Maine, Tax Map 14, Lot 2, is declared a "Dangerous Building" that is:

- a. unsanitary, and
- b. constitutes a fire hazard, and
- c. constitutes a health or safety hazard because of inadequate maintenance, dilapidation, obsolescence or abandonment, and
- d. is otherwise dangerous to life or property.

Therefore, the above-mentioned property is adjudged to be a dangerous nuisance, and shall be forthwith repaired or restored to a safe condition, or removed, or demolished within fifteen (15) calendar days of the effective date of this Order. Failing said action by the building's owner, and failing the filing of an appeal with the Superior Court within the prescribed period, the City of Augusta shall act to cause the above-mentioned dangerous nuisance to be abated or removed in compliance with this Order.

Should the City of Augusta be required to abate or remove the above-mentioned dangerous nuisance in accordance with this Order, all expenses attendant thereof shall be repaid to the City by the owner or co-owner within thirty (30) days after demand or a special tax may be assessed by the City Assessor against the land on which said building was located for the amount of such expenses and such amount shall be included in the next annual warrant to the City's Tax Collector for

collection, and shall be collected in the same manner as other state, county, and municipal taxes are collected. In addition to levying a special tax, the City may recover its expenses by means of a civil action brought against the owner.

(a) For the purposes of this section the term "voting place" shall mean the building in which ballots are cast at an election.

(b) The voting places in the city wards are the following:

Ward 1: Augusta State Armory Buker Center

Ward 2: City Center

Ward 3: Augusta Civic Center

Ward 4: Augusta Vocational Center St. Andrews Parish Hall

(c) The voting place locations described in subsection (b) of this section may be temporarily changed by Council order provided that the alternative locations and procedures comply with applicable state statutes.
